ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF POSITION

The successful candidate will teach a wide range of compulsory and optional law courses for second, third and fourth year law students. The immediate areas will include Land Tenure Law, Land Administration and Policy, Mining and Petroleum Law, Law of Industrial Relations and any other law courses which may be assigned by the Executive Dean.

A lecturer is expected to make contributions to the teaching effort of the institution and to carry out activities to develop his/her scholarly research and/or professional activities relevant to the profession or discipline. A lecturer shall work with support and direction from academic staff classified at Senior Lecturer and above with an increasing degree of autonomy as the academic gains in skill and experience.

- 2. The candidate is expected to help coordinate academic activities that concern the Law programs edit literacy journals, and conduct various activities related to teaching, research, and publication focus of the Law program at the University of Papua New Guinea.
- 3. The candidate must contribute to the development of knowledge in the field of law generally, but particularly in Land Tenure Law, Land Administration and Policy, Mining and Petroleum Law, Law of Industrial Relations and other areas of law of interest to the candidate. The candidate must have at least two years of teaching of law and or have interest in teaching law and show keen interest in publishing both locally and internationally.
